



Site Information: General Event Safety and Information

Registration, Liability Waiver, and Photo Release Form:

- Every participant **MUST** sign a liability waiver/photo release before participating in the cleanup.
- Minors must have the waiver signed by their parent or guardian, not just a chaperone.
- Waivers can be downloaded in English or Spanish from the Trash Bash® [website](#). It is recommended to print and complete the form in advance to bring with you, though extra copies will be available at the site.

Site Conditions and What to Wear/Bring:

- Trash Bash® will happen rain or shine unless inclement weather poses a danger to participants.
- Conditions can be slippery, muddy, or overgrown, and temperatures can range from cold to warm.
- Recommended attire: pants, hats, rubber boots or sturdy closed-toed shoes you don't mind getting dirty.
- **NO** sandals or flip-flops. Volunteers wearing inappropriate footwear will **NOT** be allowed to participate.
- Bring sunscreen or bug spray as needed.

Accessibility:

- The work is hands-on physical labor and requires potentially lifting heavy objects, using manual tools (pickers, bags), and walking up and down the edge of the bayou on uneven or steep terrain.
- If you have any mobility or accessibility concerns about a site, it is best to contact the specific site coordinator to discuss.

Trash **NOT** to pickup:

- Not all trash can be safely picked up or disposed of with other waste.
- Do not pick up medical waste, 55-gallon drums or other sealed closed or sealed containers, hazardous materials, broken glass, partially buried items, or heavy items requiring more than one person to lift it. Tell a site organizer the location of the item, and the proper authority will be contacted for collection.

Restrooms:

- At most sites the restroom will consist of port-a-potties with handwashing stations.
- In a few locations additional facilities may be available but cannot be guaranteed. Individual site contacts may have more specific details if needed.

What is provided for volunteers at Trash Bash®:

Supplies

- All volunteers get gloves and trash bags.
- Trash grabbers are available but are limited and are not provided to every individual. If you have your own gloves or trash grabbers you prefer to use you may bring them with you.

T-shirt

- Trash Bash® t-shirts are available at registration the morning of the event on a first-come first-serve basis.

Lunch/Drinks

- All volunteers are invited to stay after the cleanup for a free lunch. Lunch is served at the registration site.
- Lunch usually consists of hot dogs, chips, and cookies.
- Water is available throughout the event. Individual sites may have additional beverage options

Driving Directions:



From I-45 to Bay Area Park: Exit at Bay Area Boulevard and go East approximately 6 miles, crossing major intersections: Highway 3, El Camino Real, and Space Center Boulevard. Upon crossing the Armand Bayou Bridge, look for the yellow blinking light. This marks Bay Area Park on the right.

From Highway 146 to Bay Area Park: Go South from La Porte or North from Seabrook. Turn West on any one of three streets: Choate Road, Port Drive, or Red Bluff Road. Each will take you to Bay Area Boulevard where you turn left (West). Continue on Bay Area Boulevard to Bay Area Park. Turn left at the blinking yellow light and go into the park.

Parking:

Parking is available, but limited, at Bay Area Park. Please carpool if possible.

Registration Area:

Registration and lunch will be held at Bay Area Park. All volunteers must sign a liability release. Minors must have a form signed by their parent or guardian.

Area To Be Cleaned:

Banks and tributaries of Armand Bayou. Volunteers are encouraged to bring their own paddle craft and PFD, however, "from the bank cleaning" is offered to those on foot. If bringing your own paddle craft, please note that use of the craft is at your own risk, and you are responsible for ensuring safe use of the craft on the water. Your craft should only be utilized by yourself and/or members in your specific group.
